

APPLYING FOR UNIVERSITY HIGHER EDUCATION WEEK

Every year, students take a break from their regular timetable for a week in July to participate in Destinations Week – University. During this week, leading universities present on key topics such as applying to university, choosing courses, deciding between city and campus universities, and understanding university finance.

Students also take part in university workshops supported by key school staff, where they learn how to navigate the UCAS website and complete the UCAS application form. There are focused sessions on writing personal statements, and throughout the first term of Year 13, students have weekly timetabled lessons to support them in completing their university applications on time and ensuring that their references are of the highest quality.

We encourage students to be both aspirational and realistic in their university choices. This supportive approach has led to all Year 13 students at Brook Sixth Form & Academy securing places at excellent universities, with students pursuing impressive degrees ranging from Aerospace Engineering to Biomedical Sciences.







APPLYING FOR APPRENTICESHIPS



At Brook Sixth Form and Academy, we emphasize the importance of exploring all post-16 pathways from the start of a student's journey. Within the first six weeks, we host our first apprenticeship talk, delivered by industry employers. While many students aspire to follow the traditional route to university, we ensure that every student is equally informed about all options available to them.

Most presentations are held in person, although some employers opt to present remotely. Employers provide valuable insights into what apprenticeships involve and share tips on creating a strong apprenticeship application. Additionally, many employers bring current apprentices to speak with students, offering firsthand experiences from young people who are similar in age and background. This allows students to connect with relatable role models and make well-informed decisions about their future.








SIXTH FORM OPEN EVENING AND FUTURE DESTINATIONS EVENT
